of a sinful laziness. However, I can personally verify that sometimes our students (no matter what stage of education they are in) feel as though something has to give to meet the expectations of parents, teachers, and coaches. Unfortunately, what oftentimes goes first is prayer, meditation, and Bible reading. Is this ultimately the fault of the student? Yes! Even so, in our striving for excellence as Christian families and students, we have inadvertently fostered an environment where the school year is the hardest time for our students to grow in grace.

So how does this tie into a sanctified summer? Let me offer these suggestions if I may. Allowing our children to spend significant amounts of time with their Christian peers is not a negative thing. Fellowship is a vital component for Christian growth and what better time to experience that then in the summer. Allow your children to spend significant amounts of time reading the Scriptures and other devotional reading. Allow your children to spend significant amounts of time in prayer, meditation, and reflection on the glory of God. Believe it or not, often times we confuse these things with laziness or lack of productivity when in reality they are the most productive thing a Christian can do. You see, summer is a season of "fortress building" because it is a time when our Christian students feel as though they have time to enjoy, participate in, and be strengthened by the means of grace that will feed them and cause them to grow in the likeness of their Savior.

Finally, let me now offer a few words to the rest of the congregation who aren't students, parents, or grandparents. Summer is generally the season when every industry slows down (I realize there are exceptions). Let me encourage each member of this church to use the summer as a season of sanctification. Use your extra time to participate in the means of grace both personally and corporately. May the summertime be a season of sanctification that strengthens our hearts in such a manner that we no longer become depressed, discouraged, or declining in our commitment to Christ throughout the year. It is my prayer for each of you that this summer will become a time when Christ becomes so lovely to you, you would not even think about straying from His graces at anytime of the year.

Letter From The Assistant Minister A Sanctified Summer

Well dear friends, believe it or not summer time has arrived yet again. For students (and moms who teach their children), this is the most glorious time of the year. In fact, until one graduates from college, the entire year is either a build up to summer or a letdown because it's over. For parents, a sense of fear and dread is beginning to set in. The question in your mind just now goes something like this. What will I do with these kids all summer? Though I cannot offer you a fully developed treatise that will provide a satisfactory answer to this question, I would like to suggest some ways for the families and children of our church to use the summer as a season to grow in sanctification.

Rest, relaxation, fun, and more fun are words we associate with summertime. Our grandfathers were always thinking we needed jobs in the summer from the age of 3 and our grandmothers believed that time off was always a bad thing because remember, idol hands are a tool of the devil. I think we can view rest, relaxation, and fun in a more positive light. If the summer is a time to develop patterns of laziness, carelessness, and neglect then yes, we should despise the notion of fun and busy ourselves with whatever mundane activity will prevent these things. On the other hand, if the summertime is a season where we rest from one form of labor to enjoy another, then I can see no problem with this. Summer is the season of "fortress building" for the young Christian. In other words, there is a spiritual ebb and flow to the calendar year that experiences its peak in the summer season. For example, the patterns of personal worship, fellowship, and general attitude of praise to the living God are at their healthiest state 99% of the time in the adolescent/preadolescent church member in the summer. Now, this no doubt raises the question of why.

I would offer a few answers to this interesting observation regarding summertime and sanctification. First, we are an increasingly busy people. Children today are involved with 5 times the activities that I was when I was in school (and I'm still a spring chicken compared to many of our members so this wasn't all that long ago). As a result, the school year often becomes a season of spiritual depression for students. It goes this way; parents are rightly concerned about top tier grades, well rounded involvement, and enough extracurricular activities to guarantee the scholarship that is so badly needed to pay for college. All these are good things; there is just one problem, where does a growing, thriving relationship with the living God fit into this equation? It is true that a majority of the time we fail to worship God personally and daily because
