

Here are the summer mission works that we plan to assist in the year 2013 (with approximate cost of trip for each participant in parentheses):

Peru (~\$2500)

Alonzo Ramirez, a native Peruvian, was converted about 30 years ago and eventually came to the USA to further his theological training at Reformed Theological Seminary in Jackson, Mississippi. The Lord put it on Alonzo's heart to revitalize the Dutch and Scottish churches in Peru that languished after the missionaries left. He recruited several Presbyterian ministers and deacons to assist him. After 14 years the work there now includes numerous churches, Christian schools, a seminary, translation work, publication work, campus ministries, adult outreach through language studies, a variety of diaconal works, and community works. This year we are going to Cajamarca, the central city in the northern highlands of Peru. This 2000-year old city is almost two miles above sea level (some of the mountains around the city soar to almost three miles above sea level. A self-sustaining and outreach oriented Presbyterian church has been established in Cajamarca and this church has five satellite churches in the surrounding mountains and villages. This year we are taking a team of 19 to help to construct a building to minister to one of the small mountain churches that has 30 children (their current building is 7ft deep x 9 feet wide x 6 ft tall) and also to teach a Bible club, do door-to-door evangelism, preach and teach.

Richmond Hill, GA (<\$100)

This church plant is entering their fourth year in the Savannah southern-suburb of Richmond Hill. Pastor Nick Batzig is a graduate of Greenville Presbyterian Theological Seminary and the church planter. He and his wife, Anna, have three young children. This church is being built by our Lord using the ordinary means of grace – worship, preaching, teaching, prayer, etc. We helped them conduct their first open-to-the-community vacation Bible school two years ago and several families from outside the church participated. From these VBS weeks, the church has added new families each year and has come together as a body. The church is excited about our return to assist with another outreach VBS.

Will you be a part of these ministries to the body of Christ in need? There are no funds in the church budget for summer mission support. Therefore we are counting on your generous and early support. The total monetary cost to support these teams is over \$40,000. Can you help with a gift of \$50 or \$100 dollars or more? If not, any amount is helpful!!! And, as is often repeated but never fully appreciated, prayer is the essential element in raising the "full support"

of the team. Will you covenant to pray daily, or at least weekly, for the teams? Please indicate your support in these two essential areas on the bottom of this letter, cut it out and place it with your gift. Please indicate on your check that you are supporting summer missions; general or a specific trip and/or specific team member. COMMUNICATION FROM THE SESSION

On May 8, 2013 our church office was formally notified of a legal action against SPC Greenville filed in the South Carolina Court of Common Pleas made by a representative of the estate of former church member Arnold Childers who died on January 6, 2013 after being injured in an accident on church grounds on January 4, 2013. The Trustees (SPC Greenville's elected legal representatives in matters of civil law) have reviewed the complaint and made a presentation to the Session on May 13, 2013.

Our insurance company (Brotherhood Mutual) has designated David Moore of the Nexsen Pruit law firm to be Second Presbyterian Church's legal representation in the matter. The Session has designated Trustee Bobby Mann as its official spokesman and the elders ask no other member to speak publically on the issue.

Please pray for the church and its leadership as it enters a season of legal inquiry.

NEW MISSONARY

At its May 13th stated monthly meeting the Session approved a recommendation of the Missions Committee to support Rev. Joshua Reiger to be a new missionary of Second Church. Joshua grew up in a pastors home (his father was an assistant in John McArthur's church in California) and he has had a lifelong desire to use his gifts and ability in service of the church.

After service in the US Navy he attended RTS Jackson and became aware of the need for "ordinary means of grace" church planting in the United Kingdom within the Evangelical Presbyterian Church of England and Wales – a denomination familiar to our church through our own Todd and Katheryn Matocha. Josh and Gina and their two young children will be planting a new work in Northeast England and hope to be on the field by the end of this year. They will work with EPCEW through cooperation

Pastoral Letter 2013 Summer Mission Trips

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

As we serve our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, in A. D. 2013, we must not forget His departing command to us through the Apostles, "As the Father has sent Me, I also send you." We, as His disciples in the twenty-first century, must obey this command as individuals, as families, and especially as the Church. We are asking our Lord to increase our obedience and zeal in evangelism and missions. There are many ways that we can obey this command. First, we can commit ourselves to prayer, asking our Lord to give us opportunities to speak the gospel to those in our families, at our workplaces, in our neighborhoods, and those we meet. Second, we can sacrificially give to missions and missionaries - denying ourselves so that the Gospel can be preached to those who have not heard. Third, we can get involved with the missionary effort by getting involved personally. One of the best ways to do this is to participate in our Summer Missions program.

Second Presbyterian Church is planning to send two short-term mission teams this year to support the mission work in the United States and in Peru. Summer mission teams have proved a benefit to the Church of Jesus Christ in a variety of ways: 1) to encourage and help the mission churches (and the pastors and missionaries that labor there), 2) to build relationships between our church and our sister churches in these countries, 3) to give our church members, especially our youth and young adults, first-hand experience in missions work, 4) to help and encourage us to pray more regularly and pointedly for missions and our sister churches, 5) to encourage some of our people to consider mission work as their life vocation, 6) to increase our giving to evangelism and missions, and 7) to increase our own involvement locally with evangelism and missionary work.
