and mercy, Jesus rebuked them for their hypocrisy but none-theless endorsed their tithing (Mt. 23:23). Proverbs 3:9-10 gives us this wisdom: "Honor the Lord with your wealth and with the first fruits of all your produce; then your barns will be filled with plenty, and your vats will be bursting with wine." This is not a legalistic program for self-interest. Rather, it expresses the biblical principle that those who rely on the Lord for their needs will always find God's provision—and the tithe is the Bible's tangible expression of our reliance on God for our needs.

So what happens if we don't? The church will not likely close down, and a modest budget will likely be met. But these are not the standards that God would have us set! The question is not what we can get by with without tithing, but what we can attempt for God's sake if we do. What worthy missions projects might we add? What outreach or important ministry might we attempt if we tithed? The biblical plan for church finances does not involve clever motivational schemes and fund-raisers, but a God-reliant people who honor the Lord with their tithes, and above them with their offerings. Haggai warned the Israelites of old: "You looked for much, and behold, it came to little... Why?... Because of my house that lies in ruins, while each of you busies himself with his own house. Therefore the heavens above you have withheld the dew, and the earth has withheld its produce" (Hag. 1:9-10).

We don't witness? The Bible plainly teaches that God has an elect people, predestined for salvation in His grace (Eph. 1:4-5). So what difference does it make if we don't witness? The answer is that people we know and love will not be saved. God does His will through His grace at work in his people. So Paul asks, "How then will they call on him in whom they have not believed? And how are they to believe in him of whom they have not heard?" (Rom. 10:14). Moreover, while God will have His harvest, we will not have the joy of playing our part. Nothing is more fulfilling that being used by the Lord to bring a perishing sinner to saving faith! Lastly, we have the burden of knowing that we did not take an interest in the eternal destiny of those around us.

Let's not be a church that asks what difference it makes if we don't. Instead, let's be Christians who seek the difference it will make if we do. Let's commit to determined lives of prayer and see how God displays His power in response. Let's honor the Lord with our money, giving Him the first fruits of His harvest and joyfully contributing to the Lord's work in the church, and see how he will multiply our offerings in eternal blessings. And let's take a fervent interest in the eternal condition of the people around us, telling them the good news of the Savior who has come, and see for ourselves the power of God to save. In short, let's respond to the wonderful grace we have received in Christ by living to the full for Him, and let's make our lives count for the things that will never pass away.

What happens if we don't? Precious opportunities will pass us by. But we if we do, we can be sure that God will not fail us. So let's do, all because of our thanks to God for His wonderful gift in sending us His Son.

Pastoral Letter What Happens When We Don't

Ours is a church that firmly believes in the sovereignty of God. Yet we also know that believers have responsibilities that really matter. So what happens if...

We don't pray? The Bible's answer is clear. Our prayers really matter. Prayer changes things. We and others receive blessings through prayer which we otherwise would not receive. James 5:16 says, "The prayer of faith will save the one who is sick, and the Lord will raise him up... The prayer of a righteous person has great power as it is working." So what if we don't pray? James gives the answer to this, saying, "You do not have, because you do not ask" (Ja. 4:2). This suggests that one of the most important factors in our life is whether or not we pray - privately in the home and corporately in the church. Charles Haddon Spurgeon wrote: "Prayer is the ship which bringeth home the richest freight. It is the soil which yields the most abundant harvest... The reason we have not more true religion now, is because we have not more prayer."

We don't tithe? Everything we have is from the Lord, and in recognition of this Christians are called by God to tithe of our income (tithing means giving 10%). We see this from the earliest times among God's people. When Abraham returned from the spoils of victorious war, he gave a tenth of his gains to the Lord (Gen. 14:20). Jacob practiced the tithe as his obligation to God (Gen. 28:22). Jesus also endorsed the tithe. When the Pharisees emphasized tithing but neglected justice
