


Wes and Jamie Baker Peru Missions

by the Spirit of God that incites and inclines all our affections toward God and His Kingdom" (Joel Beeke). Does that zeal characterize us? What are the marks of such zeal? Joel Beeke lists several...

- "1. Christian zeal is marked by love for God. The zealous Christian is possessed with a fervent love for God that craves God's presence, grieves when God's name and cause suffer injury, and is indignant toward those who oppose and obstruct God's honor.
- 2. Christian zeal is ruled by Scripture. If we are to honor and serve God, whom we fervently love in zeal, we must know what His will and good pleasure are. That requires us to have a constant regard for His Word.
- 3. Christian zeal is devoted to good works. Knowing that the Lord has created him unto good works (Eph. 2:10) and purified him to be zealous of good works (Titus 2:14), the Christian looks more to the duty than to the reward, complaining more of his defects in performing it than the lack of expected returns.
- 4. Christian zeal begins with self-examination. The zealous Christian is more rigorous toward himself than he is to others (Matt 7:4).
- 5. Christian zeal cares about others. A zealous Christian is zealous for the eternal welfare of fellow human beings.
- 6. Christian zeal is constant. The zealous Christian stirs his affections by lifting his thoughts to eternal matters. The zealous Christian knows no place in his life in which Christ is not Lord and considers no time in his life when the grace of zeal is unnecessary." Joel Beeke identifies several factors that contribute to lukewarmness or the dimming of the fires of Christian zeal for the Lord and His Kingdom. But there is one he indicates is most important...

"Neglect of the means of grace. When we presume that we no longer need to gird up our loins (1 Pt. 1:13), lay aside every weight and every besetting sin, and run the race set before us (Heb. 12:1-2), we will naturally neglect those means that God has appointed to keep our zeal burning... To neglect the means of grace is to neglect anything that God has given us to help us grow in Christlikeness."

Therefore, we keep up our zeal for the Lord and His House (the Church) by not neglecting the means of grace but by devoting ourselves to them by faith. Dr. Beeke lists the following that we must be devoted to...

- 1. Prayer. True zeal is the gift of God and must be sought in prayer... Can any of us expect to be aflame for God if we neglect the simple means of prayer? The neglect of prayer will quickly cool our zeal.
- 2. God's Word. Another means of maintaining zeal is the public ministry of the Word of God... The preaching of the Word is a powerful



means of blowing on the coals of zeal and keeping them aflame because God Himself speaks in the sermon.

3. Public Worship. Public worship provides the ideal context for the dispensing of the means of grace. In addition to prayer and the ministry of the Word, public worship also affords us the opportunity to sing God's praises, confess our faith, receive God's blessing, encourage our fellow believers, and be encouraged by them. Hebrews 10:24-25 commands us not to neglect public worship, saying, "let us consider one another to provoke unto love and to good works: not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as the manner of some is; but exhorting one another: and so much the more, as you see the day approaching." Gathered for worship, we can exhort one another to stay the course (James 1:12), run the race (1 Cor. 9:24), fight the fight, keep the faith (2 Tim. 4:7), and not shrink back (Heb. 10:39). In the assembly we put the interests of others above our own (Phil. 2:3-4) and urge each other to press on to maturity in Christ (Phil. 3:12), to lay hold of the prize for which Christ has laid hold on us (Phil. 3:14), and to hold true to what we have attained (Phil. 3:16). Surely the coal of zeal, which would quickly cool if left alone, will burn brighter, hotter, and longer when kept amidst others."

Thanks be to God that our Savior still burns with a holy zeal for the glory of the Lord and the good of the Church. May He humble us concerning our lack of zeal and give us a spirit of repentance and answer our prayers for maturity in Christ. May God cause us to despise our lukewarmness and our neglect of that which has been purchased for us by the precious blood of Christ. May the Lord Jesus fan into flame within us a zeal for that which burns in Him. By God's grace, and for God's glory and the good of the Church, let us not neglect the means of grace, and let us pray that we might not be slothful in zeal but fervent in spirit, serving the Lord whose zeal assures our everlasting good.



Letter from the Assistant Pastor Christian Zeal

"Do not be slothful in zeal, be fervent in spirit, serve the Lord." Romans 12:11

"Surely the coal of zeal, which would quickly cool if left alone, will burn brighter, hotter, and longer when kept amidst others." Joel Beeke

Christian zeal is "an earnest desire of a concern for all things pertaining to the glory of God and Kingdom of the Lord Jesus among men." So wrote Puritan pastor John Reynolds in 1716. Does a holy passion burn within you for the glory of God and the good of the Church? Lets be clear from the start. Our zeal will never save us. Praise the Lord! It is the zeal of the Lord by which we are saved. Zeal burned within Jesus for God's glory and for our salvation. His work and His alone can fully atone for all our sin. The Spirit of Christ dwells in His people. There is always a union between the Lord and His redeemed. If zeal for the House of the Lord consumed our Lord and our Savior (Ps. 69:9; Jn. 2:17), then it should also consume us. Zeal can be abused, but we shouldn't throw out the "baby with the bathwater". Paul rebuked those who had zeal "without knowledge" (Rom. 10:2), indicating that there is a godly zeal that the people of Christ should have. What does such zeal for the Lord and His House look like? It is the opposite of lukewarmness. This is something we must ever be on the lookout for in our own hearts. Such apathy towards the Lord and His House makes Jesus want to vomit (Rev. 3:16). If Christ and His gospel and His Church are worth anything, they are worth everything. Does our zeal reflect that we are unashamed of Jesus and His Church? Does our zeal reflect that we have denied ourselves, taken up our cross and have lost our lives, as it were, for His sake and the sake of the gospel? Does the glory of God and His Kingdom drive us with a holy zeal so that we count Christ and His Church more precious to us than anything else? Christian zeal is "the gracious propensity given to the soul
